### **Letter from the Rector**

October 1, 2006

Dear Friends,

Enclosed in the *Chart* is a detailed letter about the Vestry plan for the future of Christ Church. Although we have tried to keep the Christ Church parish family well informed about our concerns for the present and our hopes for the future. Clearly we are making progress in attracting new members for Christ Church; in the long-run this is crucial. However, we need to get through the short-run to succeed in the long-run. The Vestry has clearly in mind both of those challenges.

On the first Sundays of each month we will use the traditional (Rite I) service of the Holy Eucharist at the 10:00 am service. I have become increasingly aware that many people in the Episcopal Church today are unaware of our rich heritage and traditions: liturgical, musical and theological. I would like us to become more aware of that aspect of the Episcopal Church.

On Sunday, October the 8<sup>th</sup> we will have the blessing of the animals as part of our celebration of the feast day of St. Francis of Assisi. St. Francis' actual feast day is celebrated on October the 4<sup>th</sup>. St. Francis lived in a time not unlike the time in which we live today. There was impressive economic growth throughout Europe and Francis was from a wealth merchant family. He struggled with the meaning of life in a world obsessed with growing wealth. Francis' decided that poverty and simplicity was his response to wealth. For that choice he received adulation and struggled with rejection. His 'oneness' with animals was but one part of his desire to identify fully with the simplicity and poverty of God's creation. The actual blessing of the animals will take place at the end of the 10:00 am service in the green space between the Parish House and the Rectory.

A calendar of events for the month, including news of the Progressive Dinner and adult, teenage and children's education programs, can be within the *Chart*. I commend those articles to your attention.
