Letter from the Rector

December 1, 2009

Dear Friends,

It is hard to believe that December has come. It seems as if we were just starting school in early September and here we are looking at winter and Christmas! This edition of the *Chart* is filled with news about the activities of the coming month, so I hope you will either keep the printed copy of the *Chart* or print-out the e-mail edition.

Let me start with Christmas itself and the Sunday that precedes it. Christmas is on a Friday this year and, hence, Christmas Eve is on Thursday. We will have three Christmas services: a Family Eucharist with the children's choir on Christmas Eve at 5:00 PM; a Festival Christmas Eucharist at 8:00 PM, preceded by music at 7:40 PM; and a Christmas Day said Eucharist with carols at 10:00 AM on Christmas Day.

On Advent IV (December 20), the Church School will present their Christmas Pageant (with many live—and well behaved animals) as the 10:00 AM service. There will be no celebration of the Holy Eucharist at that time. There will be celebrations of the Eucharist (with homily) at 8:00 AM and 6:00 PM.

Prior to Christmas, there will be a number of special activities. On Monday, December 7 there will be a wreath making morning at the Parish House. Our 'in-house' artists, Debbie Czeglédý and Laura Pavlovich, will lead participants through the wreath making processes. All materials will be supplied. There is a charge of \$15 to cover materials. Further details can be found within the *Chart*, including how you may make reservations for this event. The following Wednesday (December 9) at 7:00 PM the women of Christ Church will have their annual Women's Christmas Dinner. The cuisine will be Greek. The cost is \$20 and attendees are asked to bring a wrapped Christmas ornament. Reservations may be made by calling the parish office (627-2184). On Tuesday, December 15, the men will have their Christmas dinner. The cuisine will be whatever Father Lowry can think-up to cook and the cost will be \$10. Again, reservations can be made by calling the parish office.

Finally, within the *Chart*, you will find suggested scriptural readings and prayers for Advent. I hope we will find time to prepare our spiritual lives as we also prepare for all the other activities of Christmas.

This comes with my best wishes and hopes that 2009 will be a most blessed Christmas for you and those you love.

Christmas Music at Christ Church

Let me begin by first expressing my gratitude on behalf of the entire choir for the positive support and exuberant feedback we have received for the Fauré *Requiem* on All Saints' Sunday. It really was such a tremendous and profound experience for all of us, and we are overjoyed that it had the same effect on the whole Christ Church family. What we do from week to week means nothing without the support of those we seek to inspire spiritually through music in liturgy. As we begin a new liturgical year with the onset of Advent, I urge everyone to mark their calendars for the upcoming Christmas services. On **Thursday, December 24 (Christmas Eve) at 5:00 P.M.,** we will be having a slightly more informal Family Eucharist with the Building of the Crèche, telling of the Christmas story for children and singing of traditional Christmas carols. This service will be led by the Christ Church Chapel Choir, directed jointly by Laura Pavlovich and Andrew Yeargin. The Chapel Choir will also perform the "Nativity Carol" of John Rutter. At **8:00 P.M. on Christmas Eve,** a more formal celebration of the Incarnation of Our Lord will take place as a Festival Choral Eucharist, led by the Christ Church Chancel Choir. The mass will be sung from the *Missa Brevis Sancti Joannis de Deo* of Joseph Haydn, also known as the "Kleine Orgelmesse" (in English: "Little Organ Mass"). The exquisitely beautiful "Benedictus" of the Haydn *Missa Brevis* will feature soprano soloist Hannah Fuerst. Festive arrangements of Christmas carols by Sir David Willcocks and Richard Elliott for organ, strings, choir and congregation will be sung, and the choral anthems will include "On this day Earth shall ring" by H.C. Stewart, as well as "The Christmas Lullaby" and "What Sweeter Music?" by John Rutter. For those who still can't get enough Christmas music, come back on **Friday, December 25 (Christmas morning) at 10:00 A.M.** for a Rite II celebration of the Holy Eucharist and the singing of carols with organ. But don't wait until Christmas to hear beautiful music! Come hear some of the wonderful Advent hymns and choral works on Sundays as we enter this season of reflection and preparation. On Sunday, December 6, the choir will be singing "How lovely are the messengers" from Felix Mendelssohn's oratorio *Saint Paul* and "Keep your lamps," a rousing spiritual by Andre Thomas accompanied by Conga drums. The following week, the choir will sing parts of the Advent portion of Handel's *The Messiah*, featuring tenor soloist Brian D. Harris ("Ev'ry valley shall be exalted"), baritone soloist Vaughn Fritts ("But who may abide the day of his coming?") and chorus ("And the glory of the Lord").

Once again, I thank you for your continuing efforts to support the choral music program at Christ Church, and this is surely to be a most splendid holiday season! I wish you all a blessed Advent and a Merry Christmas!

From the Rector's Reading Desk

It has been a while since I shared with you what I have been reading. That is partially because I have been preparing a new course to teach in the upcoming term at the Seminary (*Religion and Human Rights*) and there has been less time for general reading. However, there are a few books I have been dipping into that may be of interest to some of you. The first is Margaret Visser's *The Gift of Thanks: Origins and*

Rituals of Gratitude. Ms. Visser wrote a similar type of book *The Rituals of Dinner: The Origins, Evolution, Eccentricities, and Meaning of Table Manners* in 1991. Both books are worth a read. I would also suggest a book I re-read almost every Advent. It is Stephen Nussbaum's *The Battle for Christmas: A Cultural History of America's Most Cherished Holiday*. The history of Christmas is complex and the unique traditions of Christmas in America are filled with unexpected twists and turns.

The other books I have been reading deal with economics and ethics. The most unexpected is Harold James' *The Creation and Destruction of Value: The Globalization Cycle*. James, a professor of history and international affairs at Princeton makes the case that globalization (and our inability to control the complexities of globalization) is at the root of the major economic crises of the 19th through the 21st centuries. He sees the stock market crash of 1929 as a local and unimportant event in comparison to the banking and economic melt-down that occurred in Europe in 1931 and moved around the world, plunging most nations into deep depression. His arguments are impressive and thought provoking. More economically mainstream is Robert Skidelsky's *Keynes: The Return of the Master*, a defense of Keynesian economics in our time of economic uncertainty. In the area of ethics I am working my way through Amartya Sen's *The Idea of Justice* and Michael Sandel's *Justice: What's the Right Thing to Do?* Both Sandel and Sen teach at Harvard and Sandel's book is based on his most popular course at Harvard.
