From the Rector

Dear Friends at Christ Church,

When you sit down and think about it, the good news of Advent and Christmas is downright revolutionary. In Advent, in the middle of a world that so values finishing things - checked off "to-do" lists, completed errands, and yes, even completed Parish Houses - that Jesus Christ's work with us and with our world is gloriously unfinished. And so even as we look back to God's first Advent in Bethlehem, we look ahead - forward to Jesus' second advent - and that day when we see the whole world transformed to reflect the glory God intended for it from the beginning of time. This season reminds us that God's work with us isn't done - and that's ok! Advent reminds us that we are called not to simply to hope for the miraculous transformation of ourselves and our world - but to expect it. God will appear in our world - and transform it through Jesus Christ.

And then, just as we get caught up in the watching and expectation, Christmas comes to remind us precisely where we are to look for God - right here, in the midst of the messiness of our lives. There was nothing neat and clean about the stable in Bethlehem - nothing high and exalted - nothing, quite frankly, that would have met our expectations. God became man in the middle of the ordinary, messy stuff of life - like us in our fullness, in our joy and in our pain, in our laughter and in our tears. So when we think of all those places where we could never possibly find God - we need to think again. Because that's where God will always be found - transforming the mundane into the extraordinary.

Athanasius of Alexandria, one of the great fathers of the church, writes that in Jesus, "God became as we are that we might become even as he is." During this holy season, we look in expectation of God's transformation of the messiness of our lives and of our world into that glorious image we can only begin to imagine.

A Holy Advent and Happy Christmas to all - I'll see you in church!

Our Choice at Christmas

But wait! This is not what Christmas is about, even though we get stuck in the craziness every year. However, if we're honest, we can admit (at least to ourselves!) that Christmas isn't crazy. 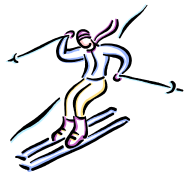
Sunday School (Kindergarten - 6th Grade)
